

CAMERA PRIVACY STATEMENT

In compliance with Regulation 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, repealing Regulation No 95/46/EC (hereinafter: GDPR Regulation) and in accordance with Act CXII of 2011 on the Right to Informational Self-Determination and Freedom of Information (Infotv.), we hereby inform our Guests intending to enter or staying on the premises of

hereinafter referred to as the Company about the following.

The Company operates a security camera system on the premises or parts of the premises leased and operated by the Company in order to protect persons, property and assets.

Data processed

The camera system shall record the images of persons entering or intending to enter the premises, indicating the place and time of recording.

Persons concerned

Persons concerned: persons entering or intending to enter the premises or parts of the premises leased and operated by the Company. If the person concerned does not consent to the processing of their data, access to the premises may be refused.

Purposes of data processing, legal basis

The purpose of the data processing is the protection of human life and physical integrity pursuant to Article 31 (1) of Act CXXXIII of 2005 on the *Rules of Personal and Property Protection and Private Investigation*, the protection of the Company's property, and the prevention and proof of unlawful acts that cannot be initiated by other means and do not entail a disproportionate restriction of the right to informational self-determination.

The legal basis for data processing is the legitimate interest in pursuing the above purposes based on Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR Regulation.

Duration of data processing

For the **camera system**, the duration of data processing for the recorded data is 30 days.



A person whose right or legitimate interest is affected by the recording of the image may request that the Company not destroy or delete the data within three working days of the recording of the image by providing evidence of their right or legitimate interest. If no request is made within thirty days of the request not to destroy, the recorded image will be destroyed or deleted.

Storing recorded data

The data processed by the security systems are stored on IT devices located in the Company's computer rooms.

Entitlement to access recorded data

Access to the recorded data and the right to review the recordings is reserved to the staff designated by the Company's management. The transmission of the recordings may be carried out on the basis of measures taken by the authorities (e.g. the police) that are entitled to seize the recordings or in order to comply with a legal obligation. The recordings may be used by the Company for the purpose of asset protection and for the prevention and proof of offences.

Data security

The Company, as the data controller, shall ensure the security of the personal data of the data subject, and shall take the technical and organisational measures and establish the procedural rules necessary to enforce the provisions of the GDPR and the Infotv.

In particular, the Company shall provide for the protection of personal data against unauthorised access, alteration, transmission, disclosure or unauthorised deletion, destruction, accidental damage or destruction and against inaccessibility resulting from changes in the technology used.

Use of data processor

The Company does not use data processors in the operation of its security systems.

Exercisable rights by the data subject

Data subjects have the following rights in relation to security systems:

- a) deletion after the expiry of the retention period for the data recorded by the system;
- b) restriction within the retention period of the data recorded by the system if the data subject needs it in order to exercise their rights (restriction may only be issued to the authority in charge of the case, the restriction lasts for a maximum of 30 days);



- c) exercising the right of access, the data subject may, within the retention period for the data recorded by the system concerned, request written information about or a copy of the data stored by the security systems.
- d) The exercise of the above rights may be initiated by e-mail addressed to the head of the Company. The request for deletion, restriction or access must specify as precisely as possible the data concerned, the date on which it was generated and any other information relevant to the exercise of the right.

Enforcement

The Company is liable to compensate for the damage caused to others by the unlawful processing of the data subject's data or by the breach of data security requirements, while the Company may be liable to pay damages in the event of a breach of the data subject's personal rights.

If the above request has not been successful, the right to seek remedies is ensured in accordance with Chapter VIII of the GDPR (Remedies, liability and sanctions), i.e. consult the National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information or a court. The court has jurisdiction to hear the case. The legal action (case) may also be initiated before the court of the place of residence.
